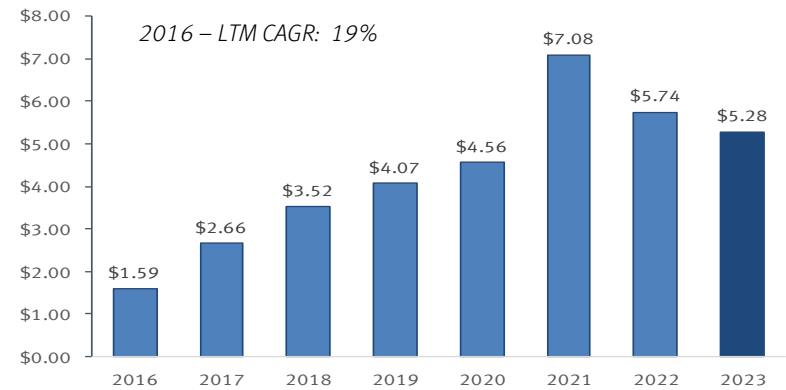

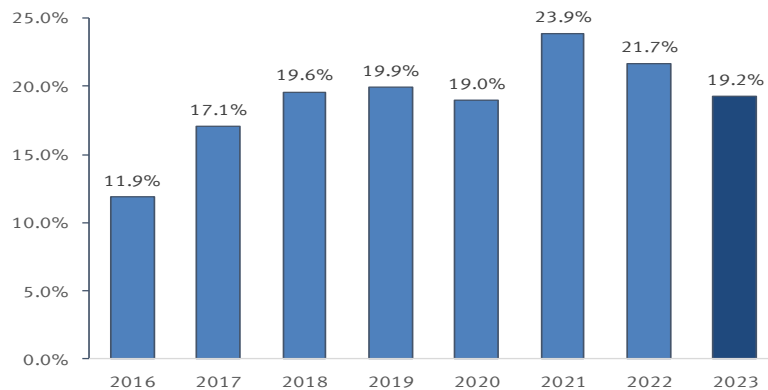
Net Revenue¹



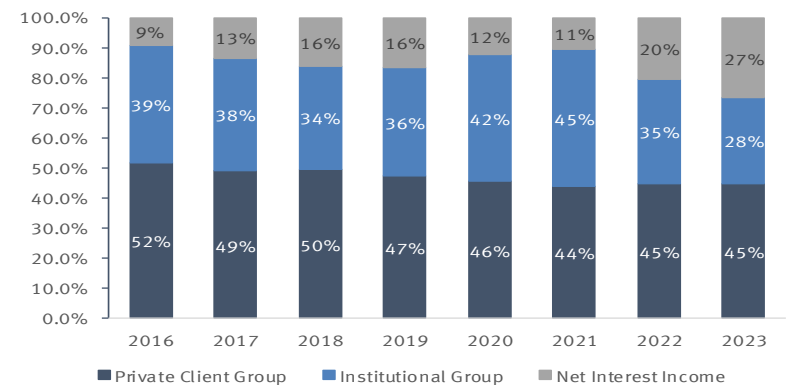
Earnings Per Share^{1,2,3}

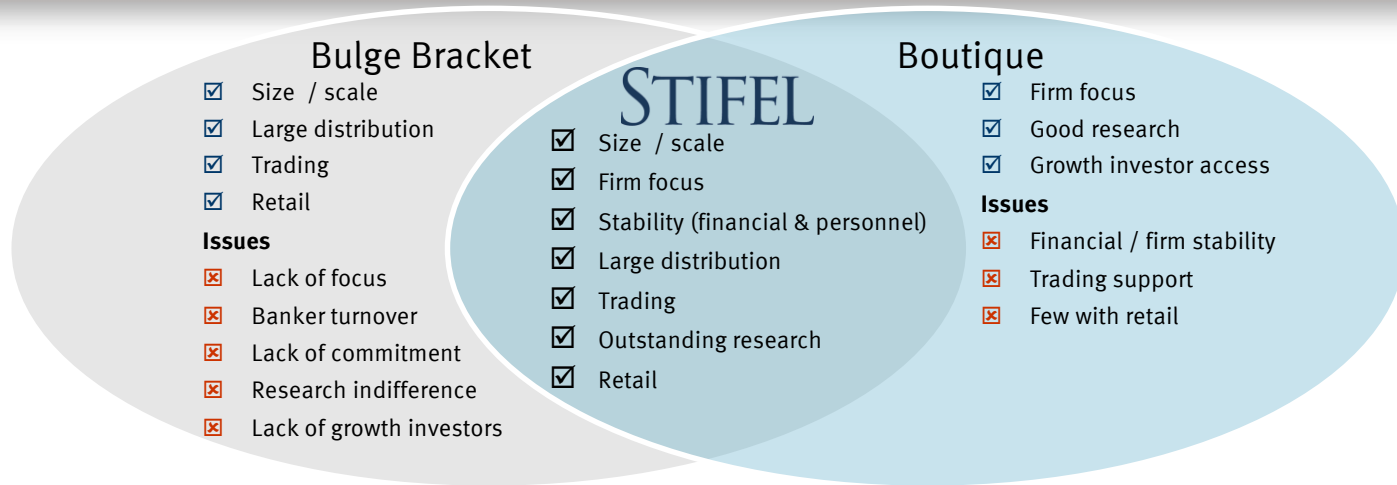

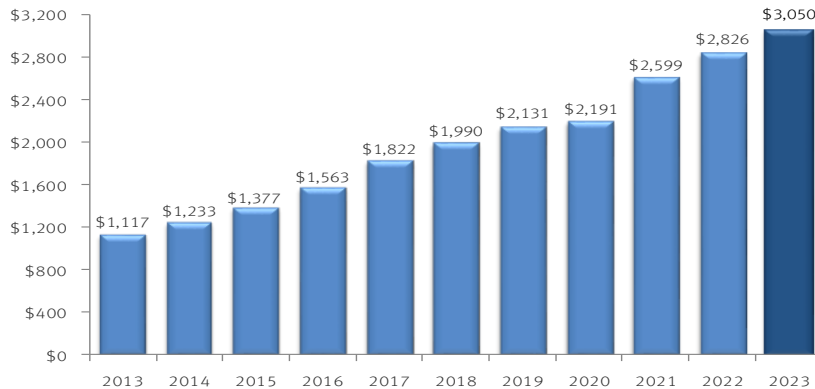

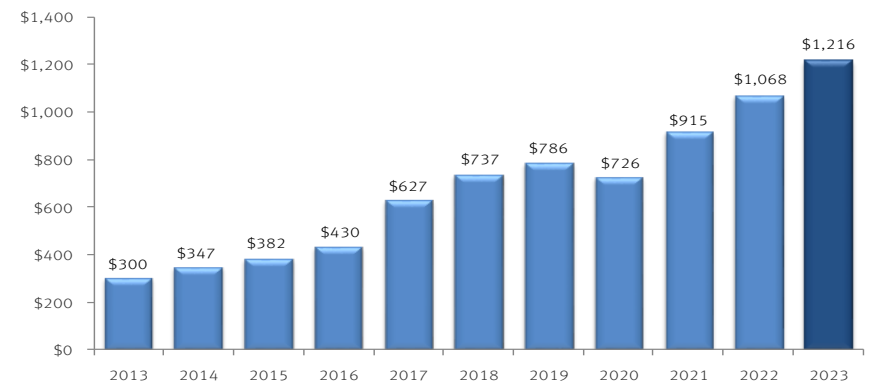
National Presence

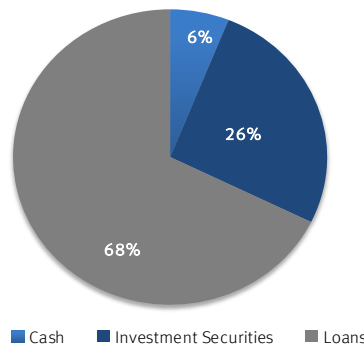
Overview

- Maintain high levels of liquidity

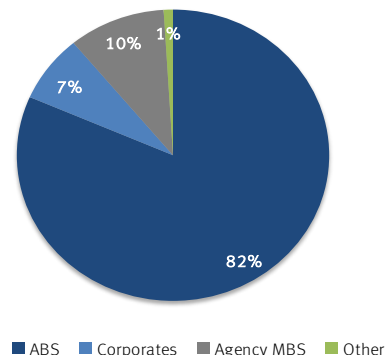

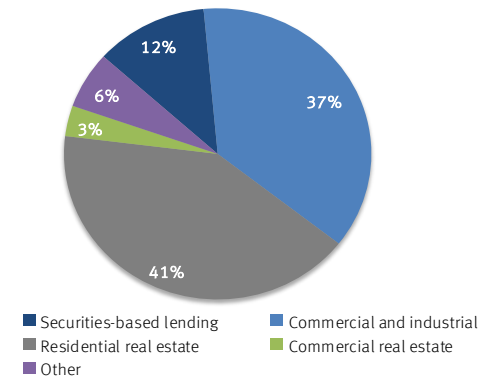
Interest Earning Assets

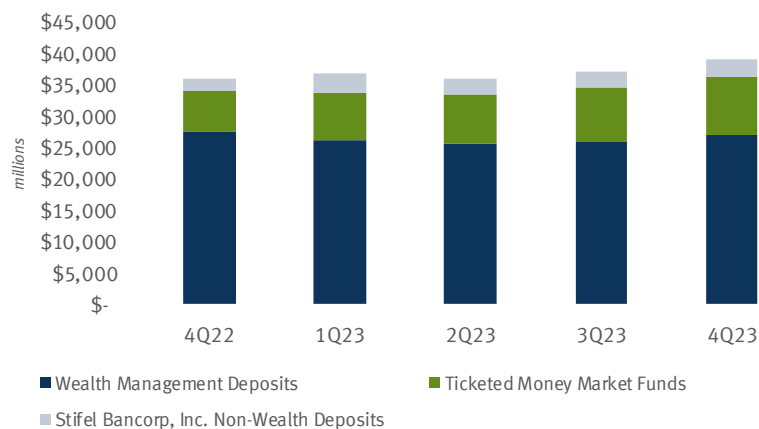

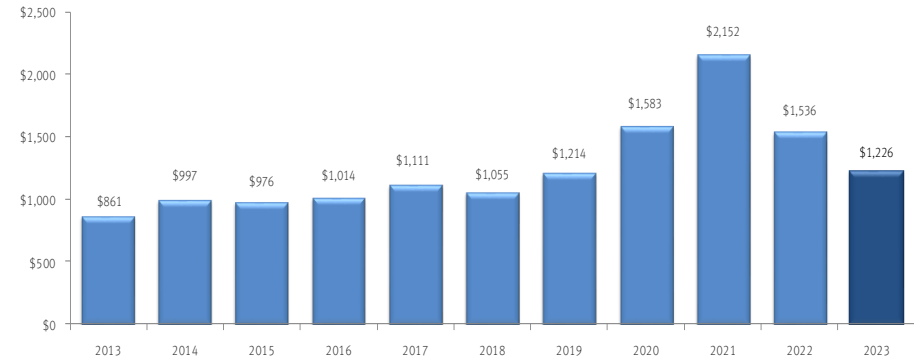

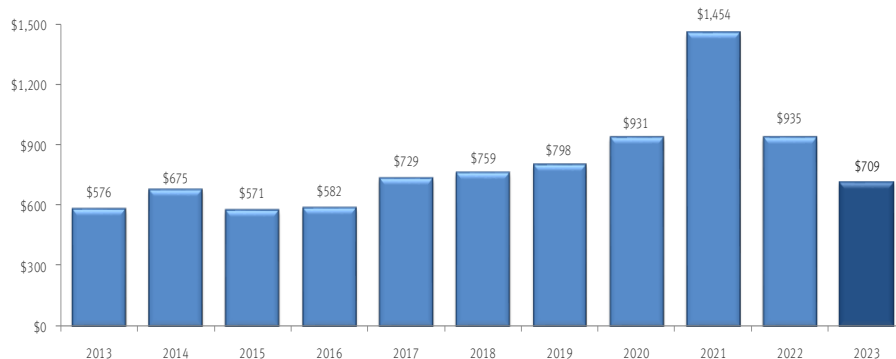

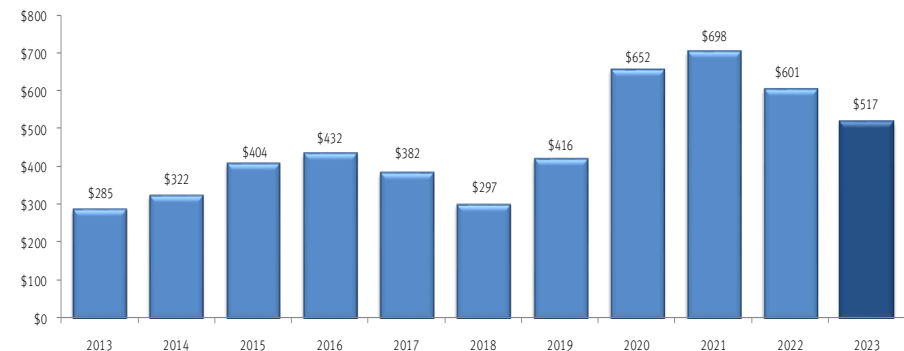
Net Revenues (\$MM)
